World War One. On the outbreak of war in 1914, the Intelligence Department at the War Office identified a number of Army officers, Metropolitan Police officers and other civilians who would be called up at the outbreak of hostilities. Following the expiry of the British ultimatum to the Germans on 5th August 1914 some fifty or so individuals received a telegram inviting them to join the newly formed Intelligence Corps.

The first proposed formation of an official army unit came in 1905 and the corps was founded in 1914 right at the outbreak of the Great War. and first landed in France on 12th August that year. The Royal Flying Corps was formed to monitor the ground and provided aerial photographs for the Intelligence Corps to then analyse.
