One pedagogy method to aid student understanding in developing critical thinking through social learning, is problem-based learning. Problem-based learning includes ascertaining knowledge regarding the problem, being able to define it, evaluating resources around the problem and determining a solution (Mannix and MacIntosh, 2011 p.139).
